

**SOIL EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION CONTROL  
PLAN CHECKLIST  
(UPDATED 09/27/19)**

To be incorporate on plans where circled:

1. A map showing the location, physical limits of each earth change activity, predominant land features including lakes, stream and wetlands, contour intervals of slope information. A map or maps at a scale of not more than 200-feet to the inch. A site location map is also required.
2. Minimum temporary and permanent SESC measures required; silt fence, silt sacks, mud mat (per the City's SESC Detail Sheet).
3. Soil information (Log of the soil borings) a soil survey or a written description of soil types.
4. Location of existing and proposed drainage structures, contour intervals or slope description.
5. Timing and sequence of each proposed earth change, in noted form.
6. Description of all temporary and permanent erosion and sedimentation control measures.
7. A schedule for maintaining all control measures.
8. Show limits of proposed grading, which also include the staging and stockpile locations.
9. Owners name, address and phone number and name, address and phone number of the plan preparer.
10. A program proposal for the continued maintenance of all permanent soil erosion control facilities, including the designation of the person responsible for the maintenance. Maintenance responsibilities shall become a part of any site or exchange agreement for the land on which the permanent soil erosion control measures are located, in necessary.
11. Submit three (3) copies of the SESC plan to the City of Livonia Engineering with completed application for determination of fees and bonds.
12. Legal description on SESC plan.
13. Standard Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Maintenance Schedule and Notes.
14. Identify all greenbelt areas and designate type of permanent vegetation to be established.
15. Include the following note on the SESC plans: "This plan illustrates the minimum soil erosion and sedimentation controls needed to prevent silts from leaving the site and is subject to change as conditions in the field warrant."
