



## Situational Awareness

- Rosedale Gardens Church will be holding a Memorial Day tribute at 6 p.m. Monday evening, featuring a bag piper and the reading of a list of passed first responders and military personnel who have served our community and country. Social distancing will be practiced and observers can walk or drive by.
- States continue to relax Stay Home orders ahead of Memorial Day as COVID-19 cases fall. New case numbers have plateaued in Los Angeles, Washington D.C. and Chicago, but have yet to decrease, concerning experts.
- Gov. Gretchen Whitmer extends the state's Stay Home order until June 12. The Stay Home order closes places of public accommodation, including theaters, gyms and casinos. The extension comes one day after Gov. Whitmer continued to relax the order, with limited gatherings, retail shopping, manufacturing and construction allowed to begin.
- A Court of Claims judge ruled that Gov. Whitmer's Stay Home order is within her constitutional power as governor. The ruling, which is now being appealed to the Michigan Supreme Court, was the result of a lawsuit put forward by the Republican caucuses of the state legislature.
- The State of Michigan is advertising expanded testing availability, offered on its [map](#) of coronavirus testing sites.

## Actions Taken

- City of Livonia departments are closed for Memorial Day on Monday. Trash pick up will not take place on Monday and will be delayed by one day this coming week.
- A request to permit temporary outdoor dining areas in connection with existing and limited-service restaurants during the COVID-19 emergency will go before the Livonia City Council for approval at its meeting at 7 p.m. Wednesday, May 27.
- Wayne County Public Health Division and the State of Michigan are testing patients and staff at Livonia's long-term care facilities.
- Livonia's long-term care facilities are still in need of additional personal protective equipment. The Together Livonia Cares initiative is providing them with resources as available. Drop-off hours are 8-10 a.m. weekdays at the Kirksey Recreation Center.
