

## Situational Awareness

- More than 1,000 Michigan residents are now hospitalized for COVID-19. The total number of hospitalizations related to COVID-19 has more than doubled since September 25.
- The State of Michigan announced 2,030 new individuals have tested positive in test results the State has received in the last 24 hours. This figure includes some cases that should have been included in yesterday's report but were not because of a data slowdown.
- The Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) issued new emergency rules for Michigan employers to help mitigate the spread of the coronavirus. The rules require employers with in-person personnel to have a written preparedness and response plan. In addition, the rules require employers to provide training on safety and health practices.
- The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services announced the launch of a partnership with Michigan State University to use a smartphone application to help monitor exposure to COVID-19 and reduce the spread of the coronavirus at MSU and in the surrounding community.

## Actions Taken

- The deadline for voter registration at a Secretary of State's office or online is Monday, October 19. After that date, voters must register in-person at the Livonia Clerk's Office.
- Navigating the upcoming Halloween holiday in the time of COVID-19 is different than ever before. The City is sharing [recommendations](#) from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that will help ensure a safe, healthy Halloween for all participating.
- Livonia bulk leaf pickup begins the week of October 26. A tentative schedule and map can be found on the City's [website](#).
- The City of Livonia updates its "What's Open in Livonia" [guidance](#), an overview of the status of City facilities, services and programs during the pandemic.
- All City facilities continue to enforce Centers for Disease and Control Prevention guidance for social distancing and mask-wearing in all facilities. Residents are encouraged to conduct their business with the City remotely.
- On Tuesdays and Thursdays throughout October, the City of Livonia Clerk's Office will be open until 7 p.m. for election business. Residents can come to City Hall or call (734) 466-2230 for assistance. Voters can return their absentee ballots using the newly installed drop box on the east side of City Hall.
