

**CITY OF LIVONIA, MICHIGAN
FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT
AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS**

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about January 29, 2024 the City of Livonia will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL93-383), as amended, to be used for the following eligible community development activities. This public notice covers the 2022 Community Project Funding Award.

PROJECTED USE OF CPF FUNDS

A. Construction of Senior Center \$3,000,000

Proposed Budget (CPF funds)..... \$3,000,000

An Environmental Review Record (ERR) which documents the environmental determinations for these projects is on file at the Jack E. Kirksey Recreation Center located at 15100 Hubbard Rd., Livonia, Michigan 48154 and may be examined weekdays 8:30 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Please email edavis@livonia.gov to set up a time to come review them. No further environmental review of said projects is proposed prior to Request for Release of Federal Funds. Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the City of Livonia at the address listed above. All comments received on or before January 28, 2024 will be considered by the City of Livonia prior to authorizing submission of request for release of funds.

CERTIFICATION: The City of Livonia certifies to HUD that the City and Maureen Miller Brosnan, in her official capacity as Mayor, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental reviews and administrative action, and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect on this certification is that upon its approval, the City of Livonia may use the CDBG funds and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Livonia’s certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if it is for one of the following bases: a) That the certification was not in fact executed by the Chief Executive Officer of the City of Livonia; b) The City of Livonia has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to HUD, McNamara Federal Building, 17th Fl, 477 Michigan Ave., Detroit, MI. 48226. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
