IMPORTANT UPDATES

In accordance with Section 765(a) of Michigan Election Law, notice is hereby given that the City of Livonia will participate in early tabulation of absentee ballots received by the Office of the City Clerk, City of Livonia, Michigan for the August 6, 2024, State Primary Election.

Early processing will occur on August 4, 2024 starting at 8:30 a.m., and will conclude until completion or no later than 5 p.m. This will take place at Livonia City Hall, located at 33000 Civic Center Drive, Livonia, MI 48154. There are 26 election inspectors scheduled to pre-process absentee ballots.

5 p.m. - Deadline for electors who have lost their absentee ballot or have not yet received their ballot in the mail to submit a written request to spoil their absent voter ballot and receive a new absent voter ballot by **mail**.



Mail and Online Registration Closes: Monday, July 22

In-Person Registration: Tuesday, July 23-Tuesday, Aug. 6 (must have proof of residency)



Mail and Online Registration Closes: Monday, Oct. 21

In-Person Registration: Tuesday, Oct. 22-Tuesday, Nov. 5 (must have proof of residency)



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ABSENTEE VOTING

A MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE

Are you unable to attend the polls or just looking for a more convenient way to vote? Vote absentee! All registered voters are eligible to vote absentee.

Don't worry about remembering to look for an application every election. Sign up for our permanent absentee voter list to receive the applications in the mail automatically. Sign-up is easy. Simply submit a request online or call (734) 466-2121.

RETURNING YOUR APPLICATION

You may return your application in person at the Clerk's Office or drop it in the red box in front of City Hall. If you choose to mail your application, please remember that you will need to affix postage in order for it to reach us in a timely fashion. An application can be obtained by:

No one may pick up your absentee ballot other than you unless it is delivered to you by the U.S. Mail. This includes spouses, members of your family and friends.

DEADLINE FOR APPLYING FOR ABSENTEE BALLOT

Application must be received by 5 p.m. on the Friday before the election.

If after the deadline has passed and it is found an absent voter ballot is needed, the elector may go to the Clerk's Office on any working day up to 4 p.m. of the day preceding election. Both application and voting the ballot will occur at this time.

REGISTRATION BY MAIL

Michigan law allows voter registration by mail, but those who do must cast the first vote in person. People who have disabilities, live overseas or are over the age of 60 are exempt.



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2024 EARLY VOTING INFORMATION

WHAT IS EARLY VOTING?

There will be one location for Livonia voters to cast their ballot prior to Election Day. Results will be tabulated at 8 p.m. on Election Day in the Auditorium of City Hall. Ballots are always secure and voter secrecy is maintained.

CITY OF LIVONIA OFFERS ACCESSIBLE BALLOT FOR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

In 2020, the State of Michigan began offering an option for voters who are blind or others with severe disabilities to vote in private and independently. Voters can request an accessible ballot which allows them to mark documents on an electronic device, using their own assistive technology, without having to travel to a polling location or to the Clerk's Office. Voters with print disabilities may apply for an accessible electronic absent voter ballot that can be completed electronically, printed, and returned to the Clerk's Office. This accessible ballot is for people with disabilities only.

If you require an accessible ballot for voters with disabilities, apply online for an accessible electronic absent voter ballot.



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ELECTION PRECINCT INSPECTORS

The Clerk's Office is now accepting applications for precinct inspectors. The position is limited to working on all General and City election days scheduled for the City of Livonia. In order to qualify, a precinct inspector must be a registered voter within the State of Michigan and a United States citizen. This is a great opportunity to serve your community and to be part of the election process.

DUTIES

Precinct inspectors must be able to:

- Assemble simple voting stations
- Attend an educational training program (mandatory every two years by the State of Michigan)
- Follow instructions provided by the precinct Chairperson
- Perform simple math calculations
- Possess inter-personal skills to work with a diverse community population
- Read and write legibly in the English language
- Work closely with others



ELECTION INSPECTOR APPLICATION

RATE OF PAY AND HOURS

- Chairperson: \$235
- Co-Chairperson: \$210
- Inspector: \$170 - Half Day \$85

Hours are from 6 a.m. until approximately 9 p.m. or until the last voter has cast their ballot and the processing and cleanup are completed. All inspectors are required to stay and help in the closeout processing and clean up. The precinct chairperson will dismiss you.





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VOTER ELIGIBILITY

You are qualified to vote in Michigan if:

- You are a citizen of the United States.
- You are at least 18 years of age by election day.
- You are a resident of Michigan and at least a 30 day resident of the city or township where you are applying to register to vote by election day.

REGISTRATION

You may register at any of the following locations:

- At the office of the county, city, township or village clerk.
- A branch office of the Secretary of State where you obtain your driver's license. This constitutes application; registration does not occur until the local clerk accepts the application.

BY MAIL

- Secretary of State "Renewal by Mail" Program allows citizens who are renewing their driver's license by mail to register to vote by mail at the same time.
- Mail Registration Program includes the state mail-in voter registration application form and the federal mail-in voter registration application form.
- Registration applicants who register to vote using the Mail Registration Program may be subject to voting restrictions.


CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address within the city, township or village, notify your local clerk. You will then be placed in the correct precinct and issued a new voter registration card. The change may also be made at a branch office of the Secretary of State or at the polls on election day.

If you move from one community to another, you must re-register to be able to vote.

NAME CHANGE

Changes in name due to marriage or legal action require re-registration. This may be done at any Secretary of State office.





STUDENT VOLUNTEERS

We are actively recruiting students to volunteer to assist at precinct polling locations throughout the City. The volunteer hours at the polls would be verified by the Clerk and could be applied toward community service hours.

We are looking for enthusiastic and responsible students to volunteer for upcoming election dates!

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- You must be 16 years of age to volunteer.
- You will be assigned to work at a polling location in Livonia. You will be required to report to your assigned precinct at 4 p.m. on Election Day. The polls close at 8 p.m. You will be required to remain at the precinct until everything has been closed out and all paperwork has been signed. You will be helping out with various end of the night closing measures, including things such as: removing signs, break down of voting booths, providing assistance to close the electronic pollbook (a laptop computer), closing out the voting tabulator and/or the Voter Assisted Terminal (VAT). It will vary based on the needs of the precinct you are assigned.
- All volunteer hours must be verified by the Chairperson at the precinct you are assigned. If you are not able to make it to your assigned precinct, please contact our office at (734) 466-2230 as soon as possible.
- Following the election, a letter from the Clerk will be provided indicating the hours of community service provided.
- Training materials can be provided prior to Election Day for your review. If you would like to see the equipment in person, we will be open for election purposes only the Saturday before each election day from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS

Wherever U.S. citizens go, FVAP ensures their voices are heard.

The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) works to ensure Service members, their eligible family members and overseas citizens are aware of their right to vote and have the tools and resources to successfully do so – from anywhere in the world.

THE FEDERAL POST CARD APPLICATION - FPCA

States administer elections in the United States, but under federal law, the FPCA allows you to request voter registration in your state of legal voting residence, request absentee ballots for all federal elections in a current calendar year, and update your voter contact information. We recommend that you send in a new FPCA every January and each time you move. Election offices send out blank ballots 45 days before election day, so allow time for your completed FPCA ballot to be mailed back and processed. The FPCA is available at FVAP.gov.

MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS

Active-duty military, their families, and overseas citizens can register to vote and request their absentee ballot using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The FPCA process for return ballots in Michigan is done by mail, but we can send your ballot to you via mail or email. Please contact your election official for more information about delivery and return methods, including email, fax, and state online portals.

NOTE: If you mail a FWAB and then receive your regular absentee ballot, you should complete and mail your absentee ballot also. Election officials will ensure that only one ballot is counted. The Federal Voting Assistance Program – FVAP.gov offers additional information on military and overseas voting in Michigan.

To follow the FPCA process:

1. Fill out the [Federal Post Card Application \(FPCA\)](#), or download a copy. Your election official may have questions, so please provide an email address or phone number where they can reach you.
2. Send the application to your election official via email or mail.
3. It is never too early to submit an FPCA! Please do so as soon as possible.
4. Please fill out and send back your ballot as soon as you receive it.

We begin mailing absentee ballots at least 45 days before Election Day.

If after submitting your FPCA, your ballot does not arrive, contact your election official first. Then: You can still vote using the [Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot \(FWAB\)](#). Print, sign, and mail your FWAB to your local election office.
